We participated in 3 meets: Claude Moore Time Trial, Potomac Regional Meet at George Mason, and Potomac Invitation at Madeira School. We also hosted our very own Inter-squad (athlete/sibling/parent meet). Our team was fortunate enough to receive about \$1,200 of donated equipment (swim bags, goggles, caps, fins, and paddles) from an independent donor. We sent 12 swimmers to the State Games (most ever by Loudoun Dolphins), all doing great and everyone brought home at least one medal. Our extended season will begin in the summer (June 30th -August 18th), and we are looking into potentially extending our practice to have a year-round swimming program. We will be having a end of season celebration with athletes/parents/volunteers, and summer cookout at Joy's Ranch (who was also so kind to donate a storage cage to keep at our practice site for all the other donated equipment. Unfortunately, a bizarre April snow storm forced a very early cancellation of the meet, but not before Team Loudoun's new distance running sensation, T.J. Thomas, posted an amazing sub 24 minute 5K in very harsh conditions. The team's perseverance was richly awarded by a picturesque day in Alexandria for the Episcopal High Championships. Seventeen athletes competed at Episcopal with many winning gold medals and shattering previous personal records!! The highlight of the regular season was the wildly successful Loudoun Valley High School unified meet in Purcellville (see pictures on page 5). Many thanks and gratitude to the dedicated volunteers whose efforts made it possible for all of our Track & Field heroes to shine their lights and grow together as teammates and individual athletes. 
