Turner, who moved from Loudoun in 2015, and former coach Bill Brichoux. We were all very glad to see them. Teams then spent an enjoyable hour and a half at Aquia Landing State Park, before heading to our destination. Afterwards, all the team attended scrimmages and the Opening Ceremonies. Everyone had lots of fun.



Saturday was game day for all of our teams. The Top Guns were at the "top" of their games winning both games on the way to Gold Medals, led by first year coach Eric Novotny.



The Wizards led by Coach "Big" Dave Hersey got the Bronze medal in their bracket. The competition was very tough but the Wizards really battled in this their first trip to States. These Wizards play hard!

The Thunder, under the guidance of longtime Coach Jeff Erikson, won the Silver



medal in their bracket. The Thunder played some of their best basketball in game one, to earn a shot at the gold medal, but could not overcome a bigger and more aggressive opponent in the second game.

WINTER SPORTS UPDATES:



#### **Basketball** (Dan Dillon):

What a year for the Basketball Program. With 116 participants we were busy every week during the season from December to March. There was tremendous growth in the program especially in the Skills Development group where we had a total of 24 athletes participate in weekly skill development training learning the basics of running, catching, dribbling and shooting the basketball. Katie Balanc, a teacher, led this part of the program and did a tremendous job. The Cool Spring Elementary School gym was electric with energy and happy faces every Saturday morning at 8:30 and we were all sad when it was the last practice. The Gophers represent the first level of team competition with facilitated games being played by athletes who are ready to learn game skills. The Gophers have 14 athletes who played in the Loudoun tournament and also had two great unified scrimmages with boys' basketball teams who came to our practice and had a great time with our gang. It was a great year for the Gophers who showed phenomenal improvement in game skills this season.

The half court program was solid with two teams, the Top Guns and the Gentle Giants. These teams competed in all tournaments and did very well. The half court part of the program is well suited to athletes will less mobility and is competitive but very friendly at the same time. Our teams exhibited outstanding sportsmanship and effort over the course of the year.

The traditional full court program is where we have the largest participation overall. The seven full court teams cover a broad range of skills and abilities but they all share a common love for the game and competitive spirit. Don't make the mistake of taking it easy against any of them, they will steal the ball or make the shot before you know what happened. The exuberant youth of the program is represented by the Wizards and Blazes who have been playing together for the past 4-5 years. They are a cohesive and friendly group that comes into the gym with a smile and leaves the same way at the end of practice. These athletes are all in the 14-17-year-old age range. The more experienced teams include the Fun Bunch, Thunder, Mavericks and Lancers. Each of these teams is very competitive in their divisions with the Lancers competing at the highest levels in the State. We are fortunate that each team has great leadership among the players and also among the coaching staff, most of whom are current or former competitive basketball players themselves.

We could not have a program like this without amazing volunteers. I would estimate that over the course of the season we had over seventy-five different volunteers supporting our program with a minimum of 50 participating on any given weekend. It is especially gratifying to see many young people under the age of 18 really get involved and make a difference. It was another great season, one that we hope we can top next year!

#### **Bowling:**

Bowling was on a roll in 2016! We had a total of 59 registered bowlers, and everyone that came out had



a great time honing their skills on the lanes. In January, we sent 12 bowlers to Fanquest- the Winter Championships for Bowling, on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. Fanquest is held each year in Northern Virginia and is a fun event for everyone. This year it took place in our backyard, the Bowl America in Sterling, VA. SOVAL was also lucky enough to be selected to send a team to NITs this year (see the article for more information on page 4). Looking forward to the spring season that will be starting again at Village Lanes, in Leesburg, on April 3<sup>rd</sup> between 1-4pm. We hope to see many of the same faces and hopefully a few new ones as well. Until then, happy bowling!
